Land for Maine's Future

This past November the voters of Maine approved a \$10 million bond issue for additional Land for Maine's Future (LMF) funds. As you are probably aware, LMF funds were a significant portion of the funding for the original Kennebec Highlands project. The Land Trust Committee is currently working on an LMF proposal to expand the Kennebec Highlands. All LMF proposals are due in April and funding decisions will be made by this summer. If our proposal is approved, we should be able to complete the project within a year.

The Kennebec Highlands expansion proposal will include properties totaling approximately 1000 acres currently owned by 10 different landowners. The Land Trust Committee is currently working with these different owners

to come to agreement on including their lands in the expansion proposal. The proposed expansion properties would expand the current Kennebec Highlands area by approximately 18%. The properties would provide additional water quality and habitat benefits as well as improving public access to the Highlands, especially from the west and north. The proposed expansion is especially valuable from a water quality perspective because the project would protect nearly 8 miles of headwater streams, over 70 acres of wetlands, and virtually all the unprotected land within the watersheds of Boody and McIntire Ponds and a portion of the watershed of Kimball Pond. Some of the headwater streams flowing from the proposed expansion area flow south into Long Pond and drain to the Kennebec River via Belgrade Stream, Messalonskee Lake, and Messalonskee Stream. The rest flow north to the Sandy River, west to Little Norridgewock Stream, and southwest to Androscoggin Lake and the Androscoggin River. In addition, the project would protect 134 acres of Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wild-

life Moderate Rated Wading Bird and Waterfowl Habitat. This is indeed an exciting and important project!

We are always looking for more potential projects as well as volunteers to help us work the projects to completion. If you are interested in working with us on the Land Trust Committee or you know of potential projects, please do not hesitate to contact us.

"BRCA HAS **ORGANIZATION** WITH OVER 1000 MEMBERS FROM 34 DIFFERENT STATES"

In 1988, a small group of visionaries who had camps on Watson Pond formed the Watson Pond Conservation Trust in order to help protect their small piece of paradise. Two years later, they bought 34 acres on the west side GROWN TO AN of Watson Pond as well as French Mountain, a popular local hiking spot overlooking Long Pond and Whittier Pond. A year later, they changed the name of the organization to the Belgrade Regional Conservation Alliance and expanded the mission to include protecting the water quality of the entire Belgrade Lakes Watershed. Now entering our 20th year, the BRCA has grown to an organization with over 1000 members from 34 different states who share a common vision with the original founders- that this special place known as the Belgrade Lakes Watershed is worth protecting so that future generations can enjoy it the same way they

Our members have backed their vision with passion, time, energy, and money. As a result we have been able to permanently protect over 6500 acres of land through fee purchase or conservation easement. We maintain a youth conservation corps that has completed nearly 500 erosion control projects to protect water quality and a courtesy boat inspector program that has stopped the spread of invasive aquatic plants. We continue to partner with U of ME, Colby College, and Maine DEP to help improve water quality. None of this would have possible without the support of you, our members. I am excited to be a part of this organization and look forward to helping it grow and achieve new initiatives such as an expansion of the Kennebec Highlands, the formation of watershed stakeholder group to protect water quality, and the development of environmental education programs to help educate the environmental leaders of tomorrow.

To make this happen, I will need your help. One area where I would ask you to help is to help us grow our membership. We are looking for new members who are a lot like our current members- in love with this part of Maine and concerned enough to help protect it. While there is much work ahead consistent with that mission, the BLA Board is also planning a long party with something for everyone to share in this special anniversary. On the first day of summer, June 21, the BLA hosts with Camp Runoia the Belgrade Lakes Triathlon, to be known as the "BLT" – the first ever triathlon in the watershed. Belgrade Lakes Watershed Forum

On October 29th, 2007, the BRCA Lake Trust hosted a Watershed Forum designed to bring lake association members, state regulators, municipal officials, code enforcement officers, and planning board members together to discuss issues affecting the water quality in the Belgrade Lakes. The focus was on understanding the makeup of the watershed, the severity of the water quality problems, the tools available to municipal officials involved with land use decisions, and finding ways to do things better. Approximately 60 were in attendance.


The Belgrade Lakes Watershed covers approximately 180 square miles and includes portions of thirteen different municipalities (Augusta, Belgrade, Manchester, Mercer, Mount Vernon, New Sharon, Norridgewock, Oakland, Readfield, Rome, Sidney, Smithfield, Vienna) in three different counties. The seven Belgrade Lakes (East Pond, North Pond, McGrath Pond, Salmon Lake, Great Pond, Long Pond, and Messalonskee Lake) are all connected hydrogically and ultimately drain to the Kennebec River via the Messalonskee Stream.

The water quality of the lakes is determined by the land use in all the municipalities within the watershed, especially within the Shoreland Zone.

The forum began with a series of presentations that provided background on the watershed, the quality of the lakes, the role of the State in Shoreland Zoning, and tools available for municipal officials involved in land use decisions. All these presentations are posted on the BRCA web site at http://

The formal presentations were followed by a panel discussion that fostered a candid exchange among the attendees with regard to permitting and enforcement processes and set the groundwork for us to work together to strengthen and improve consistency and compliance throughout the watershed. We anticipate that there will be subsequent stakeholder meetings to build on the progress made and to examine other issues that affect water quality.

Conservation Corps

BRCA's Youth Conservation Corps is busy preparing for its 13th season of operation this summer. Since our inception in 1996, we have completed nearly 500 projects in the Belgrade Lakes Watershed, and we are looking forward to another busy year in 2008. However, we are still seeking project sites for this summer. Our crews are available to help with buffer plantings, riprap, and a wide variety of services to control runoff and prevent soil erosion anywhere within the Belgrade Lakes Watershed. We are also currently hiring our work crew for this summer. We are seeking high school students at least 16 years old who are interested in protecting the water quality of the lakes and are capable of performing physically demanding outdoor work throughout the watershed.
